## HOW TO WRITE FOR ESSAGNORK



Your model can be at any stage of development, but clear model specification is essential for ESSA@work. In your extended abstract or full paper, describe clearly details like: Who are the agents? What do they do? Why? Are agents reactive or deliberative? Do agents learn or adapt behaviours? What is the environment? What is a time step? How long is each model run?



In your application form, describe clearly what specific modelling help you are looking for. Is it with implementation (software, code design, good practices)? Is it with model calibration, verification or validation? Is it with model application?
